

Row of four people (A, B, C and D) sit in a line facing the audience, each clutching a single raffle ticket. Each of them looks anxious and tense, apart from A, at one end of the line, who is lounging back, relaxed with hands in pockets. There is a small table next to A. Facing towards A, B C and D (but still open to the audience) is the Master of Ceremonies.

Master of Ceremonies: And welcome to our daily food-share raffle. We're going to start drawing the prizes now. First prize is a bunch of bananas.

(Everyone clutches their tickets hopefully.)

Master of Ceremonies: And the winning ticket is ... green 426.

(Everyone looks at their tickets, and slumps disappointedly. A pulls a ticket from his pocket.)

A: That's mine!

(Master of Ceremonies takes the bananas over to A, who puts them on the table next to him.)

Master of Ceremonies: The next prize is six bottles of water. The winning ticket is ... blue 139.

A: (Pulls another ticket from his pocket.) That's me as well!

(Master of Ceremonies takes the prize to A.)

Master of Ceremonies: Next up is a tin of baked beans ... blue 66.

B: That's me! That's me! I've won something – I can eat tonight!

Master of Ceremonies: Sorry, I had the ticket upside down. Correction: the winning ticket is blue 99.

A: (Shuffles through his pile of tickets.) Yup, that one's mine. Put it with the rest.

(Master of Ceremonies takes the prize to A.)

Master of Ceremonies: A bar of chocolate: green 271.

C: Yes

(Master of Ceremonies takes the prize to C, who clutches it lovingly.)

Master of Ceremonies: A bag of crisps: blue 406.

A· Mine

(Master of Ceremonies takes the prize to A.)

Master of Ceremonies: A frozen pizza: green 211.

A: Me again!

(Master of Ceremonies takes the prize to A.)

Master of Ceremonies: And our final prize today, a bag of apples ... green 398.

A: (Searching through tickets.) Uhhh ... wait a minute ... nearly there ... Yes! That one's me as well! (Master of Ceremonies takes the prize to A.)

Master of Ceremonies: That concludes the sharing of the food. Eat well. (Exit.)

D: What do we do now?

A: We eat our lunch. (Looks longingly at his pile of food.)

B: That's easy for you to say – you've got almost everything.

C: Yeah – and we've got nothing.

A: You've not got nothing; you've got a chocolate bar.

C: But that's all I've got.

D: And I've got nothing at all.

B: Yeah, me too.

C:

A: Well what do you expect me to do about it? It's not my fault.

D: It's hardly fair that you've got more than you need, and we've got nothing at all, is it?

A: It was a fair raffle. We all had the same chance – you just didn't buy enough tickets, that's all.

B: But we could only afford one ticket each, and you bought all the others!

A: Well I paid good money for those tickets, so I'm entitled to my prizes. It's my food and I'm keeping it. (*Picks up all of his food and exits. A, B and C look at one another for a moment.*)

Does anyone want to share my chocolate?

(Divides the bar into three and gives pieces to B and D as they exit.)
